NO. 1. ABSENCE NOTED

NO. 3. TO CONFIRM THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Minutes of the meeting on 20th September 2017 were accepted as a correct record of the meeting and signed by the Chairman.

NO. 4. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION (10 PEOPLE ATTENDED)

Notes provided by M Smith:

Mr. Smith commend the Parish Council, and in particular Cllr. Boyle, for being pro-active and alerting the community to the threat created by proposals for a new M4 Junction (18a). He also supported the statement made by the PPC on Sunday, 1st October on Facebook. He felt that it was a statement that could be supported by all the community and that we should focus on getting the flawed consultation thrown out.

However, there were some concerns that needed to be mentioned. The first deals with the PPC's position on opposing the East option while not specifically ruling out a junction (west option). In particular statements made by the chair that not a single resident attended the drop in sessions or has written to question the PPCs decision. Mr. Smith said that as a member of the technical team of volunteers working with Cllr. Boyle he had made strong representations that we should be opposing any junction and that to support a junction in principle would highly likely result in it being the east option that would be built due to the much higher cost of the west junction.

Mr. Smith also pointed out that the agenda for tonight's meeting was not posted on the PPC website.

He also felt that the minute in the last minutes of the public meeting missed a very important point about the straw pole held at the end of the meeting and that the coverage in *THE WEEK IN East Bristol & North East Somerset* accurately conveyed the poll which said "At the end of the meeting a straw poll was taken in which the overwhelming majority said they did not want either option."

Moving forward he hoped that the flawed consultation would be thrown out and in that event we should not wait for SGC to fill the gap but to organise a "People's Solution". This would involve recruiting technical expertise from residents of the whole east fringe from Filton to Keynsham to work on a proposal for public transport. This team would consult with residents' focus groups to ensure that solutions met the needs of the community. He called upon the PPC to support such an initiative.

Mr M Smith: requested an agenda item for the council to consider a focus group to come up with the people's solution.

Alexi Aragon: Strongly believes that any options will increase congestion due to the motorway being attached to the ring road. This will have a negative impact on Pucklechurch. Mr Aragon is also concerned that planning will be adjusted due to the introduction of the ring a road taking over the green belt, this will; he feels; in the long term encourage building and will increased traffic which counters the original aim of the road which is to reduce traffic congestion. £120m differential in the pricing of the junctions was noted, and Mr Aragon was concerned that the difference in the costs of the options will become the main driver for highway England, South Gloucestershire and the budget. Concerns were also raised regarding the MP's petition as the only option available was the no Pucklechurch option, no other alternative of (no junction) was offered.

NO.6. PLANNING

6a PK17/4232/RVC Variation of condition 1 and 2 attached to PK14/2889/F allowed on appeal APP/P0119/W/15/3065767 condition no. 1 to now read <http://developments.southglos.gov.uk/online-applications/> The use hereby permitted shall be carried only by the following and their resident dependants James McDonagh and Theresa McDonagh (Plot 2). Condition no. 2 to now read When the land ceases to be occupied as those named in Condition 1 James McDonagh and Theresa McDonagh the use hereby permitted shall cease and all caravans, buildings, structures, materials and equipment brought onto the land, or works undertaken to it in connection with the use shall be removed and the land restored within a further three months to its condition before the development took place.

It is believed that the rationale for putting in this planning application is that currently no policy for Gypsy and traveller sites has been agreed by South Gloucestershire Council, the original plan was that this would form part of the Policies Sites and Places document. The request is to vary condition 2 which refers to the limited time scale for the Gypsy site which is currently limited to 3 years. If this condition is granted, this will give this site permanent status. A similar request has been put upon another local council.

Objection

This is inappropriate development of the greenbelt as noted in our previous objection and as the condition is only 18 months into SGC process, it is pre-empting the recommendations that will be made within the new Gypsy and traveller sites policy.

The council's response to the consultation which has not been completed as yet, was read out and no changes were made. The following points were noted:

All gypsy and traveller sites have been informed of the consultation in person by parish councillors

The Council has been asked within public participation to oppose all options. At this point the question was posed by the Chairman to the council – Do the Council still feel that our current objections as noted in the summary regarding the M4 J16A junction options is still supported?

The council felt that they fairly represent the feelings of all its parishioners. The council recognises that parishioners will have their own views and opinions and

these can be expressed through the South Gloucestershire Council consultation process accordingly. As a council we are one vote within this consultation process, and have focused all our efforts on the Parish of Pucklechurch, informing and galvanising the parishioners and reviewing and commenting on the documentation and process that has been produced by South Gloucestershire Council. All evidence supplied has been based on fact and not speculation.

Thanks were given to Mr M Smith and the technical group for their help in obtaining some of the information to support the document.

Letters have been sent by Pucklechurch Parish Council questioning why Eastern Option road values had been quoted in the Joint Transport Strategy report when the Junction 18 A consultation and decision had not been completed. Replies have yet to be received from South Gloucestershire or indeed any of the recipients.

All councillors agreed to the content, no changes or suggestions made to the report, thanks given to GB for all the hard work and effort gone into the currently 36 page referenced document. GB, RD, BS will review final report and agree contents, GB to submit to SGC and circulate once complete
